ON THE IMPROVEMENT OF

## SHIP-BUILDING, \&c.

OUR defign in the publication of the Letters we have already printed, and propofe in future to print, on this fubject, being totally new in this country, has brought many people and opinions together, which latter muft be confequently of a various or mixed nature. The enquiries made at our Publisher's have been fuch as he (not being of the profeffion) cannot be expected to anfwer; it will therefore be neceflary to inform the Public of our plan, as well as of our reafons for purfuing it in this manner, viz.

It is intended, in order to induce ingenious men to affif, by mathematical and philofophical rcfearches, the practical Builder,

1. To collect the opinions of the Theorist, as well as of the Practical Artist, and place them in fuch a point of view as may aford ground to proceed on in there enquiries.
2. To collect the information of Admirals, Caplains, $\& x$ c. of the Navy, who have feen thefe machines in actual fervice, and confequently are able to fpeak on the refpective merits and demerits much more ably than the Conftructor.
3. To accumulate Plans and Models, as well as Actual Experiments, from which reafoning and conclufions may be drawn to render this abftrufe fubject more eafy of invertigation.
4. We publifh thefe Letters on the blue Cover of our Magazine, as the moil certain way of their being taken notice of without abridging our other Readers of their ufual quantity of amufement, and as procuring to them a greater circulation than could be effected in any other manner.-We are confcious that there does not at prefent exift any work which can be called a Scientific Treatise on the fubject of Ship-Building in our language; but this method
method of collecting fingle Effays may as reafonably be ex. pected to bring forward materials wherewith to form one, as the Houghton Collection (publifhed in a fimilar manner in 1696) has produced many excellent Treatifes on Agriculture, and confequently the improvements now fo vifible in England.
5. The Plans and Models are likewife defigned to form the material's of a Public Lecture * on the fubject, as one of the means in which the young may find improvement and the aged amufement, and may be viewed as they are accumulated.
6. The ultimatum of our Pran is, to form a Society, with able Mafters to inftruct, and Premiums or Honorary Rewhards for New Discoveries.

IIV continuation of that divifion of our plan which is to treat of the Form and Size of Ships, we muft here take notice, that an experienced Lieutenant of the Royal Navy, tho' he perfeetly agrees with our Correfpondent, whofe letter clofed the laft Number of our Original Papers in other refpects, differs from him with regard to Ships of War of 50 guns: Thefe he wiffes to retain in the fervice, not as line-of-battle fhips, tho' upon certain emergencies they might, and ought to be introduced into a fleet in that capacity, but as powerful fingle fhips, escellently well adapted to convoy fleets of merchantmen, in which fervice filips of that rate diftinguilhed themfelves in the laft war: As there are at prefent but few of them, in proportion to the other rates, it may be fufficient to produce one inftance. - The Renomin, of so guns, a prime failor, the Commander of which more than once received the thanks of our merchants for his fervices in protecting the commerce of his country home and outward-bound. Both of out Correfpondents therefore concurring in one point, that the number of Clafes in the Nary might be reduced, it remains to be determined by Officers who have been long in the fervice, and have experimentally found the advantages of employing 50 gun ihips as convoys, and by impartial Mafters of trading veffels, whenher the propofed alteration marked No. II. in our latt, which makes five Rates or Claffes, by retaining 50 gun hhips, or that marked No. I. reducing them to four, according to our Correfpondent's letter, merits the preference; and any furcher information will be thankfully received, and communicated to the Public in fome future paper.

Let us now, according to promife, inveftigate theConftruction of Ships of 44 gurs.

The contracting of fhips on their upper decks is certainly a very erroneous practice, as by this mode of confruftion, every wave, when fuch a hip goes on a fide-wind (which may be the cafe mine days out of ten) is conducted in a greater or leffer degree upon tho upper deck, thereby keeping the people continually we. Nor is this the only conrequence: It is on this deck that all the material bufineis is done, and therefore more room inould be given for working; and the fhrouds leading to the dead eyes would in that cafe have a greater bafe than they have at prefent, and would be much flronger; neither could a th.p be overfet with double the wind or fea.

The fmailer clafs of 70 gun fhips, $64,50,44$, are all of them built according to the prefent eftablifhment without contracted upper decks, cannot open their lower deck ports, even in moderate weather. They are all too fmall, and have not fufficient bearings; fo that from thefe caufes, and the ports upon their lower decks, though large, being only 4 feet 6 inches above the furface of the water, it is very unfafe at any time, and ablolutely impoffible to open them at all in a moderate breeze; and thus they are by no means a match for a French fhip of 36 guns in an engagement. wet it is eafily practicable to have them 6 feet out of the water, then they might be opened againft the enemy with the greateft fafety a moft times.
The Coneueror and the Cornwall, old 74 gun fhips, had fufficient bearings, and confequently were better fea-boats, and could open their lower deck ports almoft in any weather.
Another caufe of difaffers to men of war is, the wrong conftruction of a Pipe which it has been judged neceflary to introduce into them, in order to throw in a proper quantity of water, to mix with the bilge water, and which is pumped out again, to cleanfe the fhip, and free her from foul and noxious air. This Pipe, at prefent, is fo badiy contrived, that the working of the fhip foon breaks it, and it is well known that the Ruyal Georce was obliged to have a new one after every cruize, which at laft proved the raufe of her dreadful catafirophe. By the affiftance of ikilful workmen, we hope to be enabled hereafter to prefent a new form of a pipe, to prevent the danger fhips are expofed to from the breaking of thefe machines on the prefent conftruction; and not being as yet in poffefion of one which in every sefpect meets with the approbation of the gentlemen concerned in our patriotic infitution, we muft ffill folicit the favour of communications upon the fubject from ingenious men.

An improvement in the Operation of the RUADER has been fuggefted, fketches of which, with proper explanations, are preparing for our next Number. In the mean time, we wifh to fhew an ardent defire to oblige all our Correfpondents, by as early an infertion of their letters as the nature of our extenfive plan will admit, due regard being gaid to the arrangement of them, as they coincide with that divifion of our futject we may have under immediate confideration.
