IN December, 1789, an Essay on Ship-Building, with a catalogue of books, appeared on the blue cover of the Magazine, which has been continued by short papers ever since, in the same conspicuous place, with a few reduced drafts, which may not prove, perhaps, very entertaining to many of our readers; but to such we beg leave to remind, that they are very much interested in the subject, both for defence and trade: nor have they any reason to complain of the want of their usual entertainment, as those essays have not cost them one penny, being printed on the cover, entirely at the expence of the proprietors, and it has been the happy means of establishing a society of the most able* and respectable men of this and other countries, whose labours will probably render navigation more safe than before. We are happy also to inform them, that models for experiments on a much larger scale than has yet been tried in any part of Europe, (20 feet at least,) in order to ascertain the solid of least resistance and other criterians not yet satisfactorily determined, are about to be laid before the public. As this will require much time and expence it will be out of the power of the society to publish a volume of their transactions for two or three years to come, we therefore propose to keep the same channel open for such fugitive pieces, and afterwards to reprint them in pamphlets, as part I. and II. of which are now ready. We return thanks for those already come to hand: many are from liberal and ingenious foreigners, whose theoretical and practical abilities do them great credit. We are convinced many judicious observations still remain in the cabinets of the curious: such we solicit, and such we hope to obtain.
